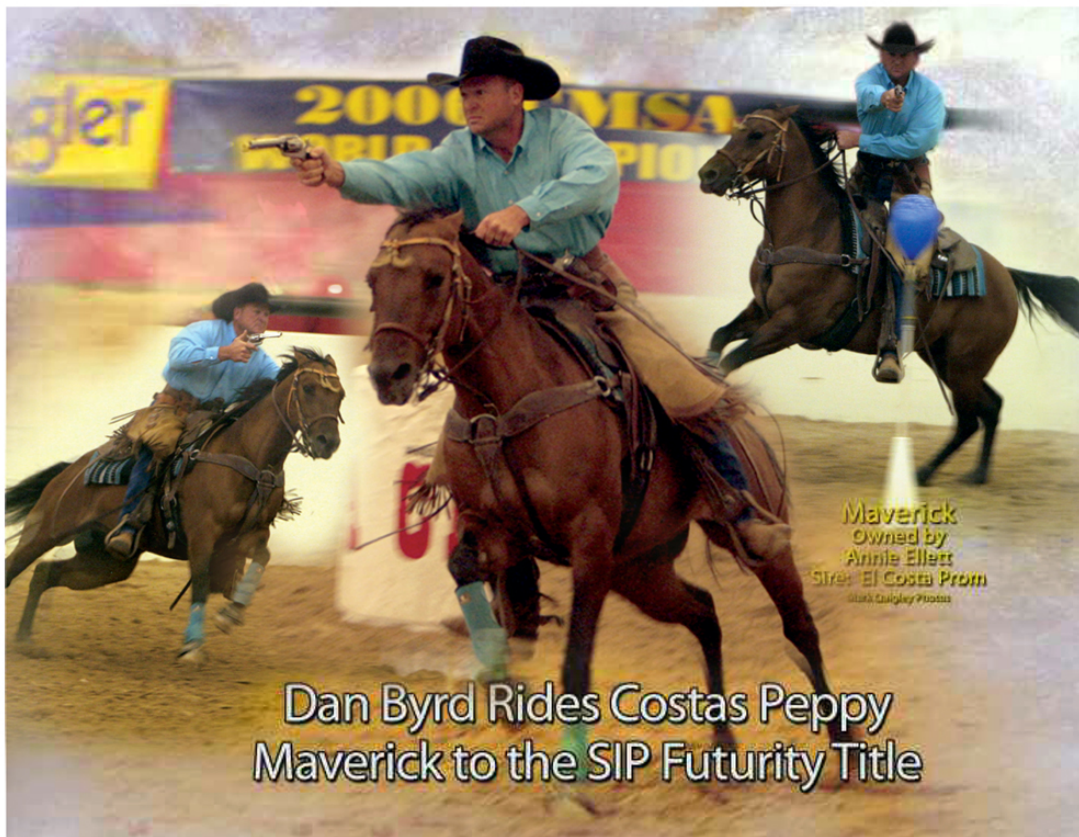


Top Horses of 2006 CMSA World Championships Las Vegas



SUNDOWNER 2006 CMSA WORLD FUTURITY CHAMPIONSHIP RECAPPING THE COMPETITION



The Futurity Class at the CMSA World Championship was highlighted on Friday night with the Stallion Incentive program (SIP). Stallions and their offspring were showcased in a display of mounted shooting horse qualities that the top breeders are striving to achieve.

The Futurity Program is central to the maturation and future of the sport, as the bloodlines that excel become highly prized by top shooters. This program helps define the preferred qualities of mounted shooting horses.

The Futurity top honors went to Jan Nolte's sorrel mare, Lynx Little Cheetah. "Cheetah"

Performance Horse of the main match by having the top raw time against all the other riders at the 2006 World.

The Maturity's reserve champion was an 8-year-old Buckskin stallion named Vodka With A Twist, owned and ridden by Larry Townsend of Darby, Montana.

The SIP is a great way to compare the colts and fillies of stallions that are registered with the CMSA SIP competition. This much sought-after title was won by Maverick, a colt of El Costa Prom, standing at stud at the Palm Ranch and owned by David and Annie Ellett of Cave Creek, Ariz. Maverick was ridden (and trained) by Dan Byrd to victory.

Taking home second-place honors was a stallion named High Dollar Snazzy, owned by Chad and Teal Henkel of Rio Verde, Ariz. He was ridden by Jim Allen.

Jack's Hickory Chex, owned by Sandy Elquist of Idaho—and ridden by Tony Jardine—won the second stage. Jardine also rode the mother of this horse in the main match and won two stages on her.

The SIP Maturity Championship was won by Dottie, a 6-year-old Paint mare owned by Diane Purcelli and ridden by Kenda Lenseigne. The second-place horse showed that Ellett's El Costa Prom is once gain proving to be a champion producer. Costa's offspring, El Costa Dun Perfected, also known as Arizona, took the runner-up honors. (He was also last year's SIP winner. Costa colts have won SIP two years in a row now.) Arizona was bought from Palm Ranch by Rick Farnsworth, who rode the 5-year-old dun gelding to victory.

The Stallion Incentive Program will develop over the coming years as one of the important facets of the Cowboy Mounted Shooting Association program. Years of records and reputation built by the offspring of the best stallions will prove very important to the horse market that is fast developing around the CMSA competitions.

The Maturity showcases older horses that have been in previous competitions or Futurities. It gives a reading on how these horses are doing in their sequential years.

Chad Little's Ty Nee Race Runner, better known as Ricochet, took first place in the Maturity. Little, one of the top riders in CMSA, rode Ricochet to the top—also winning Top
